

£3.3million to transform Lambeth's Brockwell Hall

A National Lottery grant will help restore the Grade II* listed hall, along with its stables and coach house, to better serve its diverse South London community.

Part of an overarching £6.3million investment, the ['Restoration of Brockwell Hall - Letting the Past Enhance the Future'](#) project is run by Lambeth Council in partnership with Brockwell Park Community Partners.

Thanks to National Lottery players, the project will enable the site to be used for community events and activities, weddings and corporate bookings, food and drink, exhibitions and more.

At the heart of the Brockwell Park community since 1813, a substantial grant of over £3million will help restore the hall's architecture, celebrate its history, and open it up to greater public access.

New spaces

A new café and flexible community exhibition space will celebrate the history of the hall and provide opportunity for local groups and artists to showcase their work and vision.

And a new events space for up to 200 people will be created by building a permanent roof between the hall and the stables and coach house buildings. The venue will support a range of community and commercial activities.

Opening up access

Visitors to the hall will benefit from new landscaping and stairs. An accessible path to the main entrance will be put in place, along with a new indoor lift to the basement and first floor.

A volunteer hub will be set up in the basement with its own entrance, with more rooms opened up for community use.

There will also be dedicated Brockwell Hall staff, including business administration and cultural interpretation apprenticeships.
