This week we kick off a campaign of events and blogs aimed at not-for-profit organisations across the South East looking to explore, commemorate and share the history of LGBT+ communities and their experiences. This is timed to coincide with BBC's Gay Britannia season – see the BBC's website for more on Making heritage part of society's conversation about equality.

In the South East, thanks to National Lottery players, HLF funding has already helped support a range of projects and organisations, from Reading group Support U's oral history project <u>Hidden</u> Voices to Queer in Brighton's LGBTQ+ history club.

The Centre for Fashion Curation at University of the Arts London is running the <u>Wear It Out</u> project in partnership with Brighton and Hove Museum, while Oxford University Museums are running a series of events through the <u>Out in Oxford</u> project. And we are also supporting young people aged 11-25 to explore LGBT+ heritage, working with Y Services in Hampshire, Blueprint 22 in Coastal Sussex and Photoworks in Brighton.
