

Chief Executive welcomes £1.57billion Government funding package for culture

Ros Kerslake, Chief Executive of the National Lottery Heritage Fund, has welcomed the Government's cultural rescue package as a vital step towards securing the future of the UK's heritage.

Culture Secretary Oliver Dowden has announced a £1.57billion package to support the arts, culture and heritage industries. The UK's heritage organisations and attractions are facing huge challenges due to temporary closure, a loss of income and a reduction in staff and volunteers during the COVID-19 crisis.

The National Lottery Heritage Fund has worked hard with partners in the sector to provide the evidence that DCMS needed to secure this important support from the Treasury.
