## Other useful sources of research

- HLF supports the work of the <u>United Kingdom Heritage Research Group (UKHRG)</u> hosted at Glasgow Caledonian University. You can sign up to a regular email research bulletin produced by UKHRG and the site has lots of useful links.
- Historic Scotland (HS) produces guidance and statements on a range of topics, such as the <u>Scottish</u> Historic Environment Policy (SHEP).
- Scotland's <u>Historic Environment Audit (SHEA)</u> brings together a set of measures for the condition of the historic environment.
- Scottish Natural Heritage (SNH) publishes data about the natural environment.
- The <u>Historic Environment Advisory Council for Scotland (HEACS)</u> was wound up by the Scottish Government in May 2009. HEACS produced a number of significant pieces of work on heritage topics, and these are still hosted online.
- The <u>Scottish Government (SG)</u> commissions and publishes a range of research to assist it in deriving its policies and programmes.
- The SG also publishes statistics on a wide range of topics including tourism and culture.
- Visit Scotland publishes the latest Scottish tourism statistics.
