

Future of HMS Warrior secured

In 1860, HMS Warrior was the one of the most influential warships ever built. A Victorian powerhouse, she was the pride of Queen Victoria's notorious Black Battle fleet and the world's first iron-hulled, armoured warship.

She was the largest, the fastest and most powerful ship of her day, and instantly rendered every other warship afloat instantly obsolete.

Sadly, time has taken its toll and today she is in a fragile state. Berthed at Portsmouth Historic Dockyard, her bulwarks and water bar that serve to make watertight the junction between her deck and iron hull have failed and are deteriorating to a point which places her at significant risk.
