

Thanks to a £10,000 National Lottery grant, Bristol24/7 is uncovering a century of untold stories from the city's LGBT+ community. Personal experiences, treasured memories and a record of changing attitudes will be collected and shared through a film due to be screened at Bristol Pride 2018. The aim of [Talking LGBT Bristol](#) is to use digital as a tool to help others access and learn about Bristol's LGBT+ heritage.

100 years of women's activism

Next year will mark 100 years since the Representation of the People Act 1918, which enabled some women to vote for the first time. With £60,000 National Lottery backing, Dreadnought South West's [Rebellious Sounds Archive](#) project is taking an interactive listening booth, built like a voting booth on tour across the region. It will share contemporary stories of women's activism with recordings from living memory to form a new community archive, looking back across 100 years of activism.
