The Intergenerational Jazz Reminiscence Project	The project builds on “The Story of British Jazz”, to increase access and public engagement with collections, and “actively encourage community through performance, oral history and reminiscence. The project will focus on three local areas in Essex and one area identified by the Black Cultural Archives and will explore the investment that different generations make in promoting, performing, supporting, and documenting jazz heritage. 2.	Weaving Connections	To work with four groups based in Great Yarmouth, who are excluded from participation in crafts and heritage activities because of their circumstances in life including health and disability. These groups will explore the local heritage of Great Yarmouth by relating it to the hands-on activity of basket making. Participants will learn about Great Yarmouth's herring fishing past through discussion, hands-on learning and interactive re-enactment.	Withy Arts Great Yarmouth	Award grant of £10,000 (100%)
3.	Watford's Printing Past Study Group Exhibition	This project will produce an exhibition which tells the story of the rise and fall of the print industry in Watford. Watford's Printing Past Research Group, will research and collaborate information on the print industry. At one point in Watford's history, 1 in 13 people who lived in the town worked in the print industry and it was the largest print capital in Europe. 4.	Goings and Comings - the Cambridge Jewish Experience of Migration	This project will encourage members of all ages to explore their heritage through examining the stories of their departures and arrivals; their comings and goings. Many of the stories have emerged informally through the community's reminiscence group. They now wish to build on these stories and create an exciting way of sharing these memories with others including the wider community.	Beth Shalom Reform Synagogue Cambridge	Award grant of £8,300 (99%)
5.	World War Two Trails in Essex	The project focusses on the heritage of surviving World War II defence sites in Essex. The project will create three new sign-posted walking trails in Essex, to include: the wartime defences which encircled Colchester, the 'stop-line' fortifications at Chappel Viaduct, and the shoreline defences from Frinton to Holland-on Sea.	Essex County Council Environment and Economy Chelmsford	Award grant of £9,900 (41%)
6.	Evacuation Day, 1940: re-created at Stibbington	The Evacuation Day project plans to turn the clock back 75 years to November 1940 when the village school's population was more than doubled by the arrival of evacuees from London. The project would use a special community event to share the history of the period with local people, making use of research previously undertaken (by an HLF funded project), and using artefacts, props and re-enactment scenarios to re-create life in Stibbington in 1940.
