Bedford Heritage Pod	Workshops would be held with the Higgins Museum for community and school groups to research Bedford's heritage of diversity and integration, involving object handling, exploring the archives and interactive performance sessions. A travelling exhibition pod would be created and the research undertaken would inform the interpretation offered. The pod would be interactive, combining audio, visual and performance materials. Orchards for Schools, creating a teaching resource and long-term legacy for primary schools	A two-year project to engage primary school children in learning about local orchard heritage and traditional fruit varieties. Activities include planting 900 fruit trees in 150 schools; development of orchard-related teaching materials; 60 school visits to community orchards to work with local Orchard Groups; and training of 60 community orchard volunteers. 3.	Holy Trinity Minster Church Great Paxton - Bells Restoration Project	To restore the bells, bell frame and bell fittings. The bells would be rehung on mainly new fittings and retuned around the 4th bell, which dates from 1400 and is recognised as historically significant by Church Care. Exploring Kynoch Explosive Works and Corringham Light Railway 1914-1918	To collect memorabilia and memories through archival research and engagement with local communities to explore the history of the Kynoch explosive factory. This research will be used in an interactive exhibition, guided walk, leaflet, booklet, and a series of events. A 'Kynoch collection' will be established in the museum.
