Pelton Fell Replica Miners Banner	This ten month project seeks to create a new miners' banner for Pelton Fell, working with a mixed group of 12 representatives from the Youth Group, the Partnership and local residents, including members of the Pelton Fell Remembered Group. A hand-painted double-sided banner on silk will be made by Durham Bannermakers, along with appropriate framework to allow the banner to be paraded annually in the Durham Gala. 4.	Emily Wilding Davison and local Suffragettes - The Wild Lassie	This five month project will research and develop drama based workshops about the Suffragette movement in the region, focusing on Emily Wilding Davison, prison environments and conditions for women and hunger strikes. Researchers will visit Longhorsely village and identified museums and archives, to research the local Suffragette movement and characters from that time. Celebrating Washington Old Hall	This one year project seeks to mark the 60th anniversary of Washington Old Hall coming under the care of the National Trust through a series of creative activities designed to capture the community's memories of the Hall. 23 writing workshops led by a Writer in Residence will work with school groups, visitors and community groups to record stories around the significance of the Hall to local people A community play will be developed and performed working with the Art Centre Washington and a Playwright in Residence, together with volunteers and local residents An exhibition of the research and information gathered will be displayed in the Hall for a year. This 12 month project will enable eight young people, aged 9-14 to research the history of the adventure playground movement in North Tyneside in the 1970/80s, with a focus on former adventure playgrounds in Longbenton and Meadow Well. Young people will research local media and films, archives and libraries to explore adventure playground history. Findings will be interpreted and recorded for future use. Research findings will be disseminated through presentations, by the young people, and exhibits. The collected research and images will be used to create a community mural. The work created by young people will be exhibited at local metro stations, libraries and schools. Research activity will take place with local school children to find out about the seven men listed on the Billingham cenotaph who died on the Somme, and to see if any relatives still live in the area. A month long display will be installed within Billingham Forum Leisure Centre, which will feature 100 ceramic poppies. 9.	Passing it on	Active Inglewood is a volunteer-led organisation which decreases isolation within the community through participatory activities. It has a care venue with 48 residents, many of whom are living with dementia. 12 residents living with dementia will form the core participant group. The project focuses on the familial experience of the participants and how the FWW shaped their and their families' everyday lives. Group sessions at the care home will use handling collections to explore childhood memories and stories from participants' parents. Local artists will work with the group to document their thoughts and explore FWW art and music. An accessible Victory Garden is planned to provide a space in which project outputs such as research, songs and paintings can be shared with the community	Active Inglewood	Award Grant of £10,000 (95%)
10.	Somme 100 : Newcastle Heroes	This eight month project seeks to utilise Cathedral collections as well as complementary resources at the Northumberland Fusiliers Museum, Tyne and Wear Archives, Northumberland Archives and Newcastle Local Studies Library to research and share local FWW heritage. Guided by a recruited project historian, three schools will take part in research visits to the Cathedral, their local archive, the NF Museum and see the 'Response' memorial in Newcastle to research the FWW. In school, workshops will build creative responses to form a book of remembrance. The historian and volunteers will work with the NF Museum looking at diaries, letters and photographs to build their knowledge of the FWW and enhance contextual information related to the Cathedral's collection items. An exhibition will bring this research together and incorporate each school's remembrance materials. A webpage, social media and leaflet will be used to distribute the project's research.
