1	Where are we From and Who Are We Now? – Bristol Somali Diaspora	The Black South West Network has applied for a grant of £64,700 (95%) towards a 2 year project to explore Somali heritage and identity in the UK from 1991 to the present day. The project will be launched at the 2015 Somali Festival in Bristol. Members of the Somali community will receive training in oral history and collect a series of interviews which will be featured in monthly community radio shows, as well as contributing to a year long exhibition at M-Shed. A closing event will be held to act as a gala of Somali heritage, including music, performances, talks and films	Black South West Network	Award Grant of £64,700 (95%)
2	Confidence through Conservation	The Prince's Trust has applied for a grant of £60,000 (82%) towards a project to engage 52 disadvantaged young people from Bristol with natural heritage conservation skills. Working in partnership with The Conservation Volunteers (TCV), participants will engage in short, bespoke courses of conservation activities, culminating in a celebration event at the end of each course, where they will be presented with Prince's Trust and John Muir Award Certificates. 3	Saint Peter's Church Stoke Fleming Tower Renovation Project	St Peter's Church Stoke Fleming have applied for a grant of £39,800 (34%) towards a 16 month project to restore the bells and clock within this Grade II* listed Church. The ring of six bells dating from 1777 will be renovated, and the Victorian clock will be refurbished. A programme of workshops, school visits, open days and interpretation will also take place, as well as visits to the bell foundry and clock workshop to watch the conservation work. 5	Celebrating Torbay: a year of local and family history: aiming to engage, preserve and educate	Torbay Libraries have applied for a grant of £31,700 (93%) towards an 18 month project to broaden engagement with local heritage through appointment of a part time project worker to lead a programme of activities and workshops. Proposals include recruitment and training of volunteers in areas such as research, digitisation and curatorial skills, working with local schools through a series of learning events, displays of artefacts, local history talks, workshops, clubs and outreach work with local residential homes. 6	Industry and Community: the Kenyon Photographic Project	The South West Heritage Trust has applied for a grant of £76,800 (87%) towards a 15 month project to digitise and make publically available a photographic body of work by Stanley Kenyon from 1938-1994 consisting of over 10,000 glass plate negatives and 30,000 acetate negatives. The project will digitise the acetate negatives and work with volunteers to create a full catalogue to the images. A six month exhibition at the Museum of Somerset involving A-level photography students, together with a range of activities, talks and loan boxes will also take place.
