1	Wimborne History Festival 2016	Christchurch and East Dorset Councils are seeking a grant of £59,200 (72%) towards a project to engage the community in a Festival of learning about Wimborne's history spanning the Bronze Age to the 1960s. Events and activities will include a schools engagement programme, training for young people in curating exhibitions, talks, workshops, open days, an exhibition, and a festival weekend of living history, storytelling and children's activities. 2	Caring for Salisbury's medical and health collection	ArtCare has applied for a grant of £40,000 (71%) towards a two year project to improve the condition of and access to the historic health and medical collection at Salisbury District Hospital, which includes letters by Florence Nightingale, as well as photographs, artwork and nursing memorabilia. The project will record, catalogue and digitise the collections, as well as delivering a series of outreach sessions, open days and temporary and permanent exhibitions about the collections. 3	Oral History of Axminster around WW2	East Devon Volunteer Support Agency is requesting a grant of £40,600 (90%) towards a project to collect oral histories about the life of Axminster during the Second World War. Working with partners, including Axminster Visiting Scheme, Forget me Not Reminiscence Service and Axe Vale Community College, up to 45 oral histories will be collected, and a series of heritage reminiscence sessions, oral history training, and displays will be delivered. 4	Iron Duke returns – rediscovering Bradford on Avon's industrial history	Bradford on Avon Museum has applied for a grant of £55,500 (57%) towards a project to restore and display the Iron Duke- an important example of a rubber calendering machine from 1848 currently in storage. A series of community projects will also take place, including a community film and school workshops, and the project will also create a portable exhibitions, leaflets and a website. 5	Celebrating 150 years of Bath Rugby	The Bath Rugby Community Foundation has applied for a grant of £38,000 (100%) towards a 12 month project to mark the 150 th anniversary of Bath Rugby Club. Using material from the Club's archives and gathered from supporters, players and the community, the project will develop an exhibition, website and a schools pack to engage local schools in the project. 6	Legacy to Landscape; linking King John's Oak to the future	East Devon AONB (East Devon District Council) has applied for a grant of £40,300 (81%) towards a three year project focusing on King John's Oak – one of the oldest trees in the country – and the surrounding area. Up to 250 new volunteers will be recruited and engaged in practical conservation activities including hedge laying, tree planting, scrub clearance and seed collecting.
