Pupils will visit the Jewellery Quarter and Staffordshire Hoard to learn about jewellery manufacturing - past and present, before producing jewellery items of their own inspired by Anglo-Saxon art. 3	'Go Toads!' Community Project SH- 15-02527	A one year project to help secure the future of the common toad, an endangered species. A strong education component will lead to a large number of local people learning about toad ecology and conservation, and extensive hands-on volunteering opportunities offer them the chance to put their learning into action to protect toads. The activities started during the project, and thus its benefits, have the potential to be ongoing.	Herefordshire Wildlife Trust	Award Grant of £9,400 (96%)
