9. Taylor's: Saving the Last Bellfoundry in Britain; HG-17-01942

Applicant: The Loughborough Bellfoundry Trust

Request: First round pass of £8,375,100 including development grant of £535,900 (84%)

Project: Comprehensive repairs to Taylor's Bellfoundry, which was at risk of loss, to allow it to continue to cast, repair and re-hang bells using the original factory layout. The scheme would also create a comprehensive and fully accessible visitor experience, with archive and research centre. Activities would include practical conservation workshops in traditional skills and techniques, bellmaking apprenticeships and oral history collection.

The Committee for the East Midlands recommended the project as a **HIGH PRIORITY** for support.

11. Restoring the Historic Heart of Gainsborough; TH-17-05554

Applicant: West Lindsey District Council

Request: First round pass of £1,304,100 including development grant of £54,000 (76%)

Project: A five-year project to deliver a balanced scheme of restoration and repairs across the Gainsborough Town Centre Conservation Area. Works would be centred on Lord Street and the Market Place, including the repair and reinstatement of shop fronts, signage and historic roofs. Public realm improvements would be made to the Market Place. A comprehensive programme of activities and training would be delivered including a programme of open days providing opportunities for the public to try their hand at traditional heritage skills.

The Committee for the East Midlands recommended the project as a HIGH PRIORITY (1 of 2) for support.

12. Hinckley Townscape Heritage Scheme - The Thread to Discovery; TH-17-05872 CEM 2018 (1) 12

Applicant: Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council

Request: First round pass of £773,000, including development grant of £64,500 (84%)

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Project: A programme of restoration and repair to re-establish the historic character of Hinckley town centre and to reinstate access from Castle Street to the Castle. Unsympathetic shop fronts would be removed and replaced with original designs and repairs would be made to external walls, rainwater goods and upper floor windows. Extensive heritage-led improvements would also be made to the public realm especially around the site of the castle. An associated programme of activities would be delivered.

The Committee for the East Midlands recommended the project as a HIGH PRIORITY (2 of 2) for support.
